

Navigating Academic Practice in a Changing World: *AI, Sustainability, and Scholarly Careers*



Professor Charl de Villiers

Charl de Villiers is Professor of Accounting at The University of Auckland, New Zealand. He is internationally recognised for his Sustainability Accounting research and expertise, which led to his appointment as a Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit (CNZM). Charl is also an adjunct professor at the University of Cape Town and the University of Pretoria.

Charl has over 500 research-based publications and presentations, including more than 120 articles in refereed journals, and two Routledge-published edited books. His research has often advocated for regulated sustainability disclosures, a call that has gained significant traction internationally in recent years. As sustainability and environmental concerns have become more pressing, the demand for transparency and accountability in corporate reporting has grown. Charl's research has provided robust frameworks for understanding and implementing such disclosures and governance mechanisms, helping to shape regulatory policies worldwide. As an indication of impact, his research has been cited more than 20,000 times, and his h-index is over 60, i.e., more than 60 of his research publications have each been cited more than 60 times. A Stanford University study ranks Charl in the top 100 of all accounting academics globally for lifetime citations, in the top 50 for annual citations, and among the top 2% of scientists worldwide. In 2022, he was inducted into the AAAJ/APIRA Hall of Fame for outstanding contributions to the interdisciplinary accounting research community, and in 2024 into the CSEAR Hall of Fame for outstanding contributions to social and environmental accounting research.

Charl has published in *Accounting, Organizations and Society*; *Journal of Management*; *Accounting, Auditing & Accountability Journal* (AAAJ); *British Accounting Review* (BAR); and *European Accounting Review*, among other journals. He is editor-in-chief of *Meditari Accountancy Research* and serves on the editorial boards of 10 academic journals, including AAAJ and BAR. He is deputy editor of *Accounting & Finance*, and has often served as an editor of AAAJ special issues and as a guest associate editor of BAR. Charl plays an active role in promoting sustainability accounting research in New Zealand and Australia, having established and serving as chair of the steering committee of the Sustainability Accounting Research Network (SARN) and its annual Conference. He also furthers accounting research in general, by regularly presenting and publishing on methodology, theory, the choice of research topic, what constitutes a contribution to the literature, and the writing of academic research. Charl was President (New Zealand) of AFAANZ (Accounting and Finance Association of Australia and New Zealand) from 2018 to 2020. He has maintained his links with the accounting profession as a FCA and FCMA.
